This also registered you as a Back to Netball participant. This means you can access information and support from England Netball about how to set up a team or club, where your local leagues are, coaching and umpiring courses and funding.

In addition to this, England Netball is pleased to be able to offer Back to Netballers the opportunity to become Back to Netball Members. For £15.50, in addition to the benefits mentioned above, you will also receive;

- Comprehensive Liability and Personal Accident insurance cover to cover you when you participate in England Netball Back to Netball sessions and England Netball Back to Netball Festivals. If you are injured in a session or Festival, you could claim for some of the following;
 - Temporary Total Disablement - Subject to a 14 day excess deductible; individual must be in paid employment,
 - Temporary Partial Disablement - Subject to a 14 day excess deductible; individual must be in paid employment,
 - Hospital in Patient - Confinement of 24 hours or more,
 - Physiotherapy – Subject to a £60 excess deductible,
 - Broken Bones – Subject to a scale of benefits,
 - Emergency Dental or Optical Expenses – Subject to a £50 excess deductible
